Horses And Ponies

This section is run under Category 3 of the Royal Agricultural Society Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rules
THE GROUNDS AND RING ARE IRRIGATED. JUDGING TO COMMENCE AT 8.00am for district classes. District Classes are restricted to horses owned and ridden by persons residing in the Amuri, between the Hurunui and Conway Rivers. All other classes to commence at 8.30. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED ONLY HORSES OR PONIES COMPETING IN THE SHOW ARE PERMITTED ON THE GROUNDS. FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCES The use of tranquillizers, stimulants or any drug which affects the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the owners risk. Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under the Royal Agricultural Society Forbidden Substances Judicial Committee (FSJC) procedures and rules (refer rule 89 RAS Equestrian Judges and Competitors Rule Book and rule 55a of the RAS General Rules and Regulations). The Secretary will provide facility for scratching and substitutions. RAS Equestrian Judges and Competitors Rule Book is available from the District Secretary or from RAS, P.O. Box 54, Woodend at a cost of \$15. NOVICE CLASSES: A Novice is a horse or pony that has won up to five firsts in any saddle conformation class at the day of the Show. Novice champions are not eligible for champion saddle horse. Novices may enter the appropriate novice classes for their wins, and in any open classes. The Association relies upon the integrity of competitors to record their entries wins, which can be checked by a steward and updated as required on Show Day. Novices to be shown in a snaffle bit. Competitors must be ready to enter the ring when their class is called. After final call is announced the ring will be closed and entry fee forfeited. Rider to enter only one rider class. Height and Performance Cards are to be carried at all times (refer Rule 67, RAS Rule Book). Current R.A.S. or Canterbury A & P certificates accepted. Safety helmets are to be worn by all riders both inside and outside the ring. The MOCKETT TROPHY is presented after the judging of the District Classes. All winners of District Classes in both Horse and Pony sections are eligible and must be available to be judged. ENTRY FEE: Members - \$3.50, Non-members - \$4.50 PRIZES: First -:\$10, Second - \$6, Third - \$4 Competitors may enter either Group 1 or Group 2.

R.A.S. rules state that:- All Sheep should be fairly shorn and fairly presented. This ruling applies to all classes except Corriedales, who have their own ruling.
