Dairy Cattle over 6 months of age other than those from E.B.L. accredited free herds will require a negative test for E.B.L. within 6 months prior to entry to Country Shows. When entries are received for Dairy Cattle, a copy of the current E.B.L. certificate must be forwarded with entries. If certificate not forwarded, then entries will be returned. Judging of Open Classes will take place at 9.30am on Friday, 13th June. Cattle to be on the grounds by 6.00pm Thursday, 12th June via Bli Bli Road Gates. Judging of Dairy All Breeds Competition at 9.30am on Saturday 14th June in milking competition cattle are to be on the grounds by 4.30pm on Wednesday 11th June. ALL cattle are to be removed from the grounds by 6.00pm on Saturday, 14th June, or at the chief Steward's discretion. Prize Money must be collected from the Show Office as soon as possible after 2.00pm Saturday 14th June. Cheques cannot be posted, as a receipt must be obtained for each payment. No dairy cattle will be admitted to the grounds unless thoroughly tractable and bulls over 12 months must be led a by a staff from a ring in the nose. In all Dairy classes in which age is a condition of Competition, the Entry Form shall state the actual day of birth (day, month and year). Age for classification will be that of the animal on 1st April 2008. Registration Certificates to be available. All cattle entered in the Ground Milking Classes and Group Classes must be entered and shown in the General cases. ### Ground Milking Competition

STEWARDS: Mr. Ken Pascoe, Graham McIntrye, Ray Pembleton CONDITIONS: To be held on Thursday, 12th June Open to all Registered Dairy Cattle. TWICE A DAY MILKING Cattle are to be on the grounds by 4.30pm Wednesday, 11th June. (a) Details of entries to be in the hands of the Secretary at least 4 days prior to strip out. (b) Details required Animal's name, date of birth, tattoo or identification, breed and date of calving. (c) Test to be by method approved by D.P.I. (d) The Official Strip Out will take place at 6.00pm on Wednesday 11th June. Milking for the competition to be at 6.00am and 6.00pm Thursday, 12th June. (e) Each cow is to be milked for not more than 20 minutes. A milker is allowed to milk only 5 animals. (f) Each cow will be allotted a milking order or division and is to be milked in that order throughout the competition. (g) No lactation points allowed. (h) Any cow that is supplied with milk or animal fat other than supplied in recognised protein meat as food during the tests shall be disqualified, together with the Exhibitor. The administration of medication to be done only under Veterinary Supervision. (i) To be eligible to compete cows must have calved at least 7 (seven) days prior to strip out. (j) Any cow, which in the opinion of the Steward in charge, is being prevented from yielding her full supply of milk during strip-out will be debarred from competing.

Cheques cannot be posted as a receipt must be obtained for each payment. REGULATIONS: 1. Cattle must be on grounds before 4.00pm on Thursday 12th June and must enter by the Bli Bli Road Gates & exit via Crushers Ground. NOTE: It is recommended that owners present their cattle at the yards by 3.00pm on Thursday afternoon to avoid congestion and also to allow Stewards to have all cattle penned and settled before dark. 2. All cattle must be bona fide property of the exhibitor for 3 (three) months prior to the Show. 3. Cattle cannot be entered for, or compete in, more than one class. 4. The Steward reserves the right to reject any exhibit not considered worthy of exhibition. 5. All horned cattle must be tipped before entering the Showgrounds. 6. No bull or stag can compete in any class. 7. Entries are not confined to beef breeds. All breeds or their crosses are accepted. 8. On arrival at the grounds all cattle will be allotted to respective pens with the assistance of the owner or his representative. 9. In the case of any animal showing one permanent incisor it shall be eligible only for classes requiring 2 (two) permanent incisors to be showing. 10. There must be 3 entries in a class or no second prize money will be awarded. In the event of the judge deciding that the exhibit in any class is not worthy of a prize, no prize will be given. 11. No cattle are allowed as non-competitive. 12. All exhibitors must remain outside the yards while cattle are being judged. 13. Owing to the limited number of pens, it may be necessary to restrict the number of entries by an exhibitor in any one class. 14. Champions will be selected by the Judge. All exhibits are eligible. 15. All cattle must remain in the yards until 12 noon Saturday, 14th June. Cattle in the yards after this time will be there at the owner's responsibility. Cattle must be removed from the grounds by 6.00pm on Saturday, 14th June. Please refer to GENERAL CONDITIONS regarding responsibility and care of livestock. 16. All cattle exhibited at this Show must be unloaded at ramps as specified by the Stewards. 17. The 2008 Show is an approved brucellosis-free show. All exhibitors must be able to produce evidence that exhibits are from brucellosis free herds and all D.P.I. requirements including endorsed stock permits and waybills must be adhered to.

All exhibits must be on the Showgrounds no later than 6.00 pm Wednesday, 11th June. 5. Please enter by the Bli Bli Roads Gates only. All cattle to be unloaded at ramps as directed by Stewards. All vehicles are to be parked at Crushers Grounds (monitored by security). Exit is by Crushers Grounds only. 6. No stud beef cattle will be admitted to the grounds unless thoroughly tractable. 7. All cattle must be bona fide property of the Exhibitor for three (3) months prior to the Show. 8. All ribboned exhibits must be led in the Grand Parade. Failure to do so may lead to disqualification. 9. Whilst all reasonable care is taken, the Society cannot accept any responsibility for any losses of, or damage or injury to or by, any livestock, exhibits, equipment, vehicles or any other property. 10. All exhibitors who participate in the show ring MUST wear dust jackets or Society approved uniform at all times when their animal is presented to the judge. 11. Age of all cattle to be 1st June 2008. 12. All bulls 6 months and over must have a nose ring and be led by a nose ring and halter. 13. Bulls under 6 months must have a nose ring or grip. 14. Cattle must not be introduced if they are from a property or herd in which Johnne's Disease has been known, or suspected to exist, during the five year period prior to the Show. 15. All exhibitors to have Public Liability Insurance and to have same endorsed for travelling to Shows. 16. Any exhibitors/competitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with residual current protection and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged. The use of double adaptors is prohibited and all power boards must be tested and tagged. 17. Risks identified by exhibitors/competitors will be eliminated or controlled by the exhibitor/competitor and particular attention will be paid to ensuring public safety and safety of other exhibitors/competitors. 18. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to ensure that the leaders of their stock in judging rings and parades are capable of exercising control over the animals in their care. Children under 12 years of age leading cattle in the Grand Parade to be accompanied by an adult over 18 years of age. 19. Each exhibitor/competitor will assess the risk to themselves, staff, volunteers, family, other exhibitors, show stewards, show visitors and any person foreseeable affected by the presentation of their exhibit. 20. The exhibitors/competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control comply with all requirements of the Workplace Health and Safety Act 1995 and the Society holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor/competitor of any area of the Showgrounds. 21. Stewards have the right to remove any animal from the Judging Ring if that animal is a danger to the safety of the public. 22. No dispute will be considered whilst the event is in progress. Protest to be lodged in writing within thirty minutes after the Class in dispute is completed and must be handed to the Show Secretary accompanied by a fee of \$50. The dispute committee will consist of the following Stewards and their decision will be final. Any three members to act: Rowan O'Hara, Lyn Holt, Greg Holt; Jenny McKay, Ken Pascoe. 23. All cattle must be accompanied by a DPI Travel Permit, endorsed with treatments performed (if necessary), and an owner Waybill. 24. It is the responsibility of the owner or person-in-charge of the stock to ensure that the cattle tick requirements (where necessary) have been fulfilled in regard to the entry treatments. Persons not fulfilling the requirements will be refused entry to the Showgrounds. 25. It is the responsibility of the owner or person-in-charge of the stock to contact their nearest Department of Primary Industries Stock Inspector and arrange for treatment (where necessary) of their stock according to the statutory requirements. 26. It is forbidden to administer any prohibited drug or cause one to be administered in any way whatsoever. 27. A prohibited drug means any substance originating externally to the animal (whether or not

endogenous to the animal) capable of affecting the performance or behaviour of any animal by its action upon central or peripheral nervous system, the cardiovascular system, the respiratory system, the alimentary system, the musculo-skeletal system or the uro-genital system and shall include analgesics, anti-histamines, anti-inflammatory agents, blood coagulants, diuretics, hormones and their synthetic counterparts, cortico-steroids, anabolic steroids, local anaesthetics, muscle relaxants and tranquillizers and vitamins. 28. Any exhibit which has been brought to the Showgrounds and is found to have had administered to it any prohibited drug as defined above may, without prejudice to any other action which may be taken in respect of the matter, be debarred by the Show Stewards from competing in any event for which it may have been entered. 29. No drug, hormone or tranquillizer shall be administered to any animal exhibit except under the direction of the Society's Veterinary Surgeon who will advise the Stewards if in his opinion such drug, hormone or tranquillizer is likely to have any effect upon the animal which would be material to its chances of being award a prize and in such case the Stewards may debar the animal from competing. In Prime Cattle, growth promotion substance is permitted. 30. A Show Steward may at any time direct the Society's Veterinary Surgeon to take a sample of blood, saliva or urine from an exhibit for testing. 31. Animals in Classes 1 to 8 to be shown in one class only.
