## Horses

DEAR COMPETITOR WELCOME TO THE HORSE SCHEDULE FOR THE 2008 ROCKHAMPTON SHOW 3rd TO 5th JUNE, 2008. PLEASE READ THE SCHEDULE CAREFULLY AS THERE WILL BE SOME MAJOR CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS YEARS. A camping site will cost \$35.00 for the duration of Show or part thereof (from Sunday 1st June - Friday 6th June) and a covered stable will be \$30.00 for the same period. Outside these times will incur a fee of \$15.00 per night. Day stalls will be available at a cost of \$15.00 per day from 5:00am to 6:00pm after which these day stalls will be locked. Horses remaining after these times will incur another fee. Day stalls must also be booked and paid in full by closing date to be allocated. (One horse per stable - NO EXCEPTIONS.) On arrival at the Showgrounds you will be directed to your Camping and Stabling by the Horse Superintendent and issued with a sticker to verify that you have paid for these facilities. This sticker must be prominently displayed in your vehicle and on your stable, otherwise another camping and stabling fee will be required. An ample amount of sawdust will be supplied. Should people wish to supply their own bedding, it must be sawdust or shavings only - no straw will be permitted on the grounds due to fire regulations. After the supply of sawdust is exhausted competitors will be responsible to supply their own sawdust and shavings. CLASS NOMINATION PROCEDURES For the 2008 Show, ALL HORSE nominations must be received at the office by Friday 9th May, 2008. PRIZE MONEY Prize money will be available from the Show Office at the following times:- Tuesday 3 June 2:00pm-7:00pm Wednesday 4 June 2:00pm-7:00pm Thursday 5 June 10:00am-6:00pm Please check and sign for prize money as there will be no changes after money has left the office. SECTION ONE - HORSES Held under the by-laws and regulations of the Rockhampton City Council which are deemed to be included herein as if inserted at full length. JUDGING REGULATIONS APPLYING TO HORSE SECTION 1. Sound horses only will be accepted. 2. Any person, including a competitor or an exhibitor, who wishes to lodge a protest, shall do so in writing to the office of the Manager, together with the sum of \$50.00, within one hour of the completion of the event. Any person, whether competitor or not, who, in the opinion of Show Management, behaves in an offensive, threatening or insulting manner, either inside or outside the ring, to any official of the R.C.C. or judge, shall be liable to disqualification from further competition and shall be liable to be removed from

the grounds. a. Management reserves the right to cancel any event. b. Prize money will not be paid to any person other than the winners. Please note that half prize money will be paid in classes with less than five entries. c. The name of horses must be stated at the time of entry with all particulars asked for. Incorrectly filled in entries will not be accepted. 3. Competitors nominated in two rings where times clash must make a choice of which event they are to compete in and, with the exception of championships, events will not be held up for late riders under any circumstances. 4. Classes for local hacks events are confined to Competitors residing in a 50km radius as shown on the enclosed map. 5. Any competitor having a financial association with any judge in the last twelve months shall not nominate. This will be strictly enforced and at the absolute discretion of the committee. 6. Application for camping site must be made with show entries for a fee of \$35.00. ENTRIES CLOSE FRIDAY 9TH MAY, 2008. 7. A charge of \$30.00 per stable FOR THE ENTIRETY OF show is payable with entry fee. Owing to the limited number of horse stalls, stalls will be allocated in order of receipt of entries/bookings. STALLS TO BE USED FOR THE STABLING OF HORSES ONLY, and could possibly be allotted for day of competition only. The R.C.C. cannot be responsible for the stabling of all horses. One (1) horse per stable. NO EXCEPTIONS. Day stalls will be available at a cost of \$15.00 per day from 5.00am to 6.00pm, stalls will be locked outside these times, horses remaining will incur another charge. Stall to be booked and paid for along with entries. ABSOLUTELY NO TIE UP ON PERIMETER FENCE. 8. In the event of any person placing horses in boxes or stalls without authority, the horses will be at once removed from the Showgrounds by order of the Ring Committee at owners risk and expense. 9. The allocation of stalls and the movement of horses and gear to and from such stalls shall be under the control of the Horse Superintendent. Exhibitors not carrying out the instructions of the Horse Superintendent may, if so desired by the Ring Committee, be debarred from competing and the animals concerned must be removed from the Showgrounds. 10. No stallion may be entered in hack or riding classes, except where specifically stated in the schedule. 11. Age of all horses to be computed as from 1st August. Every horse foaled before 1st August in any year shall be deemed to be one year old on that date. 12. All horses entered for competition in stud classes must be registered in a stud book of their respective breed society recognised by the Royal National Association. Registration papers (or copies) must be produced upon request. Where breed regulations require, nominations must be accompanied by breeding details. 13. In any class for which a prescribed age is a condition, the only horses that can be entered or compete are those the age of which, calculated by clause 15 is in accordance with the conditions. No horses under or over the prescribed age can compete. 14. Competitor must report to the Steward in charge of the respective judging ring when called. 15. Horses entered in any class for which a prescribed height is a condition, MUST be measured by the official measurer who will issue Competitor with a receipt to be produced upon request. 16. The Official Measurer will attend the Showgrounds as follows, Tuesday 2.00pm - 4.00pm Wednesday & Thursday 7.00am - 8.00am. When measuring a horse, galloway or pony, an allowance of three eighths (3/8) inch is to be made for shoes. When an exhibitor disagrees with the official measurer's figure for an animal which has been measured with shoes on, he may, should he so desire, have it measured without shoes. The official measurer may, at his discretion, request the removal of shoes from an animal prior to measurement. Should a horse, galloway or pony be found by the official measurer to be over or under height for the class in which it has been entered, it may be transferred to a corresponding horse, galloway or pony class. Apart from the aforementioned provision for measuring, animals will be measured once and once only. 17. In the event of their being no competition in a class the merit of the exhibit shall be the sole guide in awarding or withholding any prize, also if the merit of the exhibits in any class or championship is not, in the opinion of the judge, sufficient to entitle them to a prize, the judge may withhold any or all prizes. 18. Management reserves the right to substitute a judge where deemed necessary. 19. Foals accompanying their dams must be haltered and kept under control. 20. Horses shall be paraded on the days and at the time indicated in the official programme. 21. All the exhibitors and attendants must obey the instructions of the horse section Superintendent while they or their exhibits are within the precincts of the horse pavilion and adjacent yards. If any person fails to carry out the instructions of the horse superintendent then the ring committee may order the whole or part of the exhibits or any such person to be removed from the Showgrounds and may cancel the whole or part of the nominations of such

person. 22. No horses shall be displayed or exposed for sale on the Showgrounds without permission of the Manager and must compete in the Show. 23. An Exercise yard for horses will be available. Exercising of horses in any other section of the grounds particularly on lawns is strictly forbidden, and the R.C.C. reserves the right to cancel the entry of Exhibitors so offending. 24. The birth certificate of each competitor in classes where age is stipulated, must be produced if required. 25. Horse measuring receipt must be carried at all times while competing. 26. Any animal which, in the opinion of the Stewards is not in a fit state to be exhibited, may be rejected by them, and debarred from competing in the class or classes for which it is entered. Any animal rejected must be removed from the Showgrounds as soon as the exhibitor is notified. 27. The use of hormones and/or tranquilisers is prohibited. Any exhibitors violating this regulation will be dealt with by Management. 28. Horse floats will be permitted to load or unload horses at a special pick up point on the corner of Lion Creek Road and Exhibition Road. The time limit for the use of this area will be thirty minutes, and vehicles must display a special Show sticker. 29. An exhibitor or competitor who competes in an event in which a person or animal has not been correctly nominated, will be liable to a fine or disqualification at the discretion of the horse and ring disputes committee. The owner of such animal will be considered equally guilty with the rider of the animal. 30. Any person breaking any of the rules, by-laws or regulations of the Rockhampton City Council, will be liable to a fine or disqualification from any further competition, as may be decided by the relevant disputes sub-committee. 31. Horses not to be on the grounds before 9.00am Sunday 1st June 2008 and must leave by the following Sunday 8th June 2008. 32. The R.C.C. accepts no responsibility for exhibits and will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused by an exhibit. It shall be the condition of entry that any exhibitor will hold the committee blameless and indemnified against any legal action arising from such accident. 33. All galloways must be over 14 hands and not exceeding 15 hands. 34. All attendants must be suitably attired. 35. It is a request that all stallions and mares in led-in classes must be kept under control at all times with either bits or chains. 36. ALL DOGS ARE TO BE LEASHED OR OTHERWISE EFFECTIVELY RESTRAINED FROM ROAMING ON THE GROUNDS. FAILURE TO OBSERVE THIS RULE COULD LEAD TO DOGS BEING COLLECTED BY COUNCIL DOG CATCHER. 37. A Maiden horse is one that has never won a blue ribbon at any Agricultural Show at the close of nominations. 38. A Novice horse has never won a championship ribbon at any Agricultural Show at the close of nominations. 39. Classification for Hack classes is to be conducted 30 minutes prior to the commencement of hack classes in their respective rings. 40. Official E.F.A.Q. Measuring cards /Show Horse Committee Queensland Cards will be acceptable for measuring. 41. ALL junior competitors are reminded of the mandatory ruling requiring the compulsory wearing of AS/NZS 3838 or EN 7384 or ASTN F1163 helmets in ALL phases. This ruling will be enforced with NO exceptions. 42. ALL competitors, if not members, shall pay admission to the Show, the sum prescribed, unless provided with a pass by the secretary. 43. Helmets to be worn at all times whilst riding in Showgrounds Complex. 44. Marshalling of classes will be done in groups to allow safe passage of horses and competitors across public accesses. Should competitors not be in marshalling area supplied after third call they will not be allowed to cross in to centre ring until next marshalling group. This may mean they could miss a class. 45. In junior rider classes an amateur rider is one that has not won a championship or reserve championship at any agricultural show. PLEASE NOTE: THE DAY OF COMPETITION IS SHOWN IN BRACKETS ABOVE THE SECTION OR CLASS. SUCH PROGRAMMING MAY BE SUBJECT TO CHANGE. LOCAL CLASSES See Regulation 8 Classes for Local Events are confined to competitors residing within a 50 kilometre radius of Rockhampton
