ALL PRIZE WINNERS MUST BE IN GRAND PARADE Prize Money will be paid out after Grand Parade The use of tranquillisers, stimulants or any drugs capable of affecting the performance of horses and ponies is forbidden.

Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the show and that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. All horses and ponies in classes of prescribed height must be measured, shoes or no shoes, and all placegetters must produce a measuring steward's certificate to the Ring Stewards on request (0.5mm allowed for shoes) Only official height certificates will be accepted. Ages of all horses shall be computed as at August 1. All horses or ponies competing either in competition classes or ring events must be entered in the name of the Bona Fide Owner or a member of his or her family. All lease horses or ponies competing at this Show must be registered with the RAS. Such leases must be for a term of not less than 12 months, and must be registered before entries are made. Although it is provided that horses may compete in more than one class, any or all such classes may be judged simultaneously at the convenience of the Judge or Steward. In all such cases exhibitors having an exhibit entered in more than one class must elect which class they compete in. All novice ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit. Horses/ponies must carry their performance cards - failure to do so will result in elimination.
