Please send in by post. All cattle must be from a TB Clear Status Herd. 1. A copy of the current TB test certificate must be attached to entry form. The Society must be notified at the time of entry of any testing to be carried out after the closing date of entries or of any potential TB issues that may arise after entries have been submitted. Owners entering cattle must sign the declaration printed on the entry form. 2. There are two documents required. First document is a TB Test Certificate. For animals from a Declared Movement Control Area, all animals aged three months or older are to be TB tested and have a clear test within 60 days prior to being moved to the Show. All other animals must be from a herd that is up-to-date with its current routine TB testing requirements. 3. Second document is a TB Animal Status Declaration Card. This is a legal requirement for all animals being moved. All animals entered must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated TB Animal Status Declaration Card showing a TB Clear status in accordance with present legislation. Animal individual numbers must be included on the TB test sheet. These cards may be inspected at the unloading area. 4. For cattle being moved to the Show a NAIT approved RFID tag will be mandatory for all cattle, including day old calves. NAIT approved RFID cattle tags are white only. Please do not remove tags if cattle are identified with Animal Health Board or MINDA tags.

General Information Please note: This year there will be straw in the Cattle shed, all exhibitors are responsible for cleaning their stalls out. All bulls other than yearlings to be rung through the nose, or led with a suitable clip. All other bulls to be under adequate adult supervision. No feed is provided. Age of cattle to date from 1st June. Entries "in-milk" not to be milked prior to judging. All entries must be named on entry form and DOB stated. All entries are made subject to the rules and regulations and by-laws of the RAS and South Otago A & P Society. The exhibiting of all Dairy Cattle in New Zealand is governed by the RAS Dairy Cattle Show Code of Ethics document. A \$5.00 levy is to be charged per in-milk cow per show i.e. if an in-milk cow is entered in more than one class at a show then the levy is still \$5.00. There is no levy on exhibiting young stock. Exhibitors or persons entering this show shall be deemed to accept and be bound by these by-laws regulations and procedures.

AGE OF RIDDEN EXHIBITS Exhibits under three (3) years of age are not permitted in any ridden or driven (harness) class no matter what the rules of any affiliated Breed Society or Kindred Society may prescribe. Rules and Regulations:

1. Loose boxes and yards allocated on a first in, first served basis. Priority given to the competitors who associate help to the Society.
2. The use of tranquilizers, stimulants, or any drugs capable of affecting the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden.
3. Yellow Card - This Show/Event supports the RAS 'Yellow Card' system. A Yellow Card will be issued, in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behavior as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rule Book, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording of the 'Yellow Card' system is available to view on the RAS website - www.ras.org.nz.
4. Forbidden Substance - The Rules of the Royal A & P Society New Zealand in regard to Forbidden Substances apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. Forbidden Substance - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, 2015 Royal A & P Society (RAS) Equestrian Rules donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardiovascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.
5. Arrears - No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other Show/Event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.
6. Summary of RAS Resolution Process - the full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is in regards to an RAS official, the show may request the assistance of RAS Head Office as to how to deal with this in an appropriate manner.
7. Novice Classes: Open to hacks, hunters and ponies that have not won 6 conformation classes prior to the show (A win in an open class to count as one win in Novice). Paced and mannered wins do not count in conformation classes.
8. Paced and Mannered Championship: winners of novice and open paced and mannered classes in Saddle Hack, Park Hack, Hunter and A and B & C pony and Saddle Hunter pony classes to compete for champion and reserve sashes at conclusion of classes.
9. Conformation class prize winner: only first prize winner from conformation classes is to parade for championship consideration. Only after selecting the champion should the horse or pony second to the champion in the qualifying classes come forward for the judging of reserve champion; except for Section 49 (leading rein), where 1st and 2nd prize winner in all classes is eligible for consideration for the champion and reserve champion sashes.
10. Local status: exhibitor resides within a 40km radius of Balclutha.
11. Numbers must be worn at all times.
12. Competitors must parade or forfeit prize money. Grand parade and prize tickets to be taken to the Secretary's Office at the conclusion of the grand parade to collect prize money. Dispensation can be applied for in writing with entries, consideration will be given by the Committee.
