This certificate showing individual animal identification numbers must accompany completed entry forms when returned to the Secretary. 3. All exhibitors must sign the declaration on the reverse side of the official entry form. TB National Identification of Cattle & Deer: Exemptions for movement to Show: Animals being moved to a show may be exempt under the Biosecurity Regulations 1999 as follows: Dairy cattle may be moved to a show without official primary or secondary ear tags provided that: The animals are moved directly to and from the place of show under the direct control of the owner. The animals carry a mark registered to a breed society. A permit-to-move the animal without official ear tags has been issued by Agriquality New Zealand.
